FOUR GENERATIONS

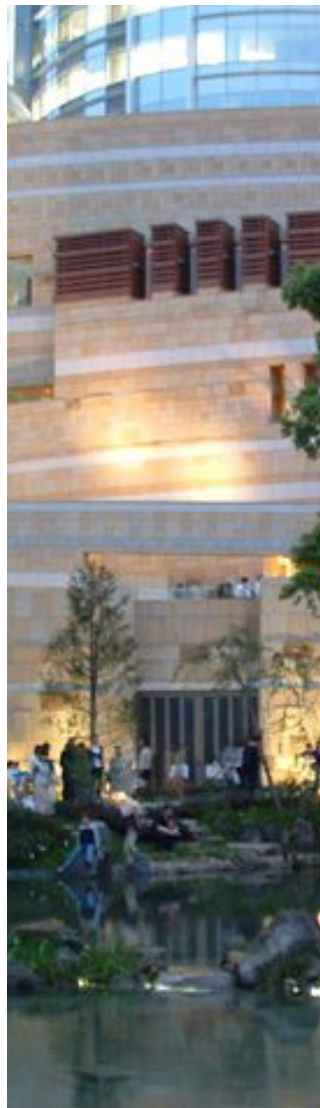
